



Nancy Clendaniel Di Domenico

October 13, 1944 - September 27, 2017

Nancy Clendaniel Di Domenico passed away three weeks shy of her 73rd birthday within weeks of unexpectedly being diagnosed with an advanced stage of pancreatic cancer. She passed away at her home at Lake Tahoe, California. She is survived by Peter N Di Domenico her husband of 47 years; Matthew N Di Domenico her son; F Brooke Clendaniel her brother; and nieces and nephews.

Nancy earned a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in home economics and a minor in chemistry from the University of Delaware and a Masters of Housing degree from the Department of Home Economics at the University California San Francisco.

Nancy held diverse and interesting positions including: copy editor for the public relations department at J. Walter Thompson on Madison Avenue; Home Economist for Pennsylvania Power and Light where she presented live demonstrations on television involving cooking and product usage; teaching at the University of California San Francisco; office manager for Solergy in South Park of San Francisco; Realtor in Marin County in California, and most notably tutoring her son Matthew through home school.

She was the mainstay of her immediate family and will be sorely missed by Peter and Matthew who could never have been prepared for her passing away.

Nancy and I spent all 4 years in Warner Hall together and she immediately welcomed me as a friend and introduced me to her Delaware friends. We attended most of the same Home Ec. and Chemistry classes together and just hit it off. I would say we were both fairly introverted, detail oriented girls and she became my best friend and the only girl from my class that I have stayed in touch with. How did the years go by so quickly.

We visited each other's homes and I remember one special beach trip a group of us took to her family's Bethany Beach home at the end of a school year. I think we were seniors. We had a wonderful bond fire on the beach and none of us were drinkers but someone brought a watermelon, cut it open and poured vodka all over it!! Scandalous but a fond memory (: I also remember being so sad when Nancy told me a few years later the beach house was taken away in a storm. Was it ever rebuilt? I think I remember she said the land was taken away as well.

Nancy was a bridesmaid in my wedding and I remember Tom and I came to your wedding. I have 2 pictures from your special day that I'll scan in and send in my next e-mail.

I loved hearing Matt safely arrived and that she had the joy of being a mother. I know he was a shining star in her life. Please share my condolences with Matt. My husband and I were sitting at the kitchen counter reading Christmas Cards together last night when I opened your letter, read it and just put my head down and sighed): Tom took it from me and read it and we said a prayer for Nancy. 

Clearly you and Matt are in our thoughts. Please reach out if we can be helpful in any way. We will leave Sunday for Europe, back on the 14th.




