From the very beginning, Attigen amazed everyone with his intelligence, passion, and humor. He had a remarkable gift for conversation, able to out-argue even the most knowledgeable adults with wit and confidence. Those lucky enough to share a discussion (or should we say debate) with Atty would often find themselves fact-checking his claims, only to find he was always correct.

Attigen had a deep love for cooking. Even as a toddler, his adventurous palate set him apart, enjoying everything from ikura with raw quail eggs to spicy Indian dishes. As he grew, his passion for food blossomed into a talent for cooking, where he impressed his family and friends with homemade pasta and perfectly cooked steaks.

The outdoors and traveling, held an even greater piece of his heart. From backcountry skiing to wilderness backpacking, Atty thrived in nature. He began backpacking with his parents at 7 months old, followed by an annual trip to see the Perseid Meteor Shower, which sparked a lifetime of adventure. From hiking the John Muir Trail with his dad, to exploring the basin's

wilderness with his closest friends, these journeys grew into cherished memories.

For someone so young, Attigen had the chance to see and do so much. He traveled to Nicaragua, Greece, and often to his family home in Mexico.
